



## AUSTRALIA Visa Guide

### Intakes Available

**Australia offers three main intakes for international students:**

1. February Intake: Main intake, with most courses available.
2. July Intake: Second major intake, with many courses available.
3. November Intake: Smaller intake, with limited courses available. **Student Visa**

### Types

- 1. Student Visa (Subclass 500): Allows full-time study in a recognized education institution.**
  - Eligibility: Enrolled in a course, sufficient funds, English proficiency.
  - Duration: Duration of the study program plus extra time post-completion.
- 2. Student Guardian Visa (Subclass 590): For guardians of international students under 18 years.**
  - Eligibility: Parent, custodian, or relative of the student.
- 3. Temporary Graduate Visa (Subclass 485): For recent graduates to work temporarily in Australia.**
  - Eligibility: Completed an eligible qualification in Australia.
  - Duration: 18 months to 4 years depending on the qualification.

### Cost to Study

- **Undergraduate Programs:** AUD 20,000 – AUD 45,000 per year.
- **Postgraduate Programs:** AUD 22,000 – AUD 50,000 per year.
- **Vocational Education and Training (VET):** AUD 4,000 – AUD 22,000 per year.

- **English Language Courses:** AUD 300 – AUD 500 per week.

- **Australia Awards Scholarships:** Fully funded scholarships by the Australian Government.
  - **Destination Australia Program:** Scholarships for studying in regional Australia.
  - **Endeavour Postgraduate Scholarship Awards:** For high-achieving international students.
  - **University-specific scholarships:** Various universities offer their own scholarships.

### Cost of Living

- **Accommodation:** AUD 90 – AUD 440 per week.
- **Groceries and Eating Out:** AUD 140 – AUD 280 per week.
- **Public Transport:** AUD 30 – AUD 60 per week.
- **Entertainment:** AUD 80 – AUD 150 per week. **Job Prospects**
- **Part-time work:** Up to 40 hours per fortnight during study periods, unlimited hours during scheduled course breaks.

- **Post-study work opportunities:** Temporary Graduate Visa (Subclass 485) allows graduates to gain work experience.
- **Sectors with high demand:** Healthcare, engineering, information technology, education, and trade services.

### **Additional Information**

- **Health Insurance:** Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) is mandatory.
- **English Proficiency:** IELTS, TOEFL, or PTE Academic scores are generally required.
- **Application Process:** Apply online through the Department of Home Affairs, providing required documents such as Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE), financial evidence, and health insurance. **Useful Links**
