Intakes Available

1. Autumn/Fall Intake (September/October)

- Most popular intake with a wide range of courses and universities open for admission.

2. Spring Intake (January/February)

- Suitable for students who missed the autumn intake, with fewer courses available.

3. Summer Intake (May/June)

- Limited intake with specific courses, often shorter programs or specific disciplines.

Student Visa Types

1. Student Visa (formerly Tier 4)

- For students aged 16 or over who have been offered a place on a course by a licensed student sponsor.

2. Child Student Visa

- For children aged 4 to 17 who want to study at an independent school in the UK.

3. Short-term Study Visa

- For short courses such as English language courses lasting up to 11 months.

4. Graduate Visa

- Allows students to stay in the UK for at least 2 years after successfully completing a course in the UK.

Cost to Study

1. Tuition Fees

- **Undergraduate: £10,000 to £38,000 per year depending on the course and university.**
- **Postgraduate: £11,000 to £32,000 per year, with MBA and specialized programs costing more.**

2. Living Expenses

- **London: £1,200 to £1,500 per month.**

- **Through UCAS for undergraduate courses or directly to the university for postgraduate courses.**

4. Receive CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies)

- **Provided by the university after acceptance.**

5. Apply for the Visa

- **Submit an online application, pay the visa fee, and attend a biometric appointment.**

6. Prepare for Arrival

- **Arrange accommodation, book flights, and prepare documents for entry clearance.**
